
OUR MISSION

OUR PAST

The Modesto Gospel Mission had its beginnings in 1948 when John Haine saw the need to feed the hungry and homeless men of Modesto with food for the body, and the Gospel of Jesus Christ for their souls. Leftover funds from one of Billy Graham's first crusades, located at the edge of downtown Modesto, provided the seed money to start the Modesto Gospel Union Mission. A group of Christian businessmen became the first leaders, and the Mission became a formal non-profit corporation in 1953. The Modesto Gospel Mission, Inc. is a 501(C)(3) charity, and donations are tax-deductible.




OUR FUTURE

The vision for the Modesto Gospel Mission is to provide a place for refuge, recovery, and restoration to the broken, poor, and homeless in our local community. The Mission is always striving to find new ways to provide needed assistance to our guests while clearly communicating the truth and love of Jesus Christ and His transforming power. As we forge ahead into the future, the Mission plans to keep expanding our services and our reach as the need for spiritual salvation and life transformation has never been greater.

WHAT WE DO

The Mission is able to serve some of the most broken people in our community by helping them get off the streets and radically change their lifestyle through a myriad of programs and services. We offer hope through the love of Jesus – in word and deed. The Mission ministers to the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of each guest. More than a food bank or soup kitchen, we provide daily shelter, clothing, meals, showers, Bible studies, life skills classes, employment training and assistance, addiction recovery, a medical clinic, a day program, an after school youth center, and more. To meet these needs, the Modesto Gospel Mission depends on local gifts from individuals, churches, groups, foundations, and businesses that care about the poor and homeless in Stanislaus County.

New Life Program (Men)





Building off a foundation of transformation through Jesus Christ, the New Life Program exists to encourage men and women as they prepare for their return to society. The New Life Program is designed to help individuals escape and recover from homelessness and addiction through practical, spiritual, emotional, social, educational, vocational, financial teaching, and encouragement.

During this 12-month program, residents rebuild work ethic through hands on transferable working skills doing jobs around the facilities; attend meetings weekly with Case Managers and or Chaplains; attend daily Bible studies; meet for financial advising once a week; and are encouraged to find a local church to attend. Program residents also participate in classes such as, Anger Management, Addiction Studies, Healthy Boundaries, and Career Development.

After career development is completed, the program residents are assisted in finding outside employment. Once employed, they are given 6 months to save money, pay off debts, purchase a vehicle, and save for independent housing.

After care is also available after completing the program. The Mission offers outside housing with continued accountability, goal setting, and case management. This offers the graduate ample time to reach their goals of transitioning into society successfully.

We look forward to celebrating your newfound life and accomplishments through the Modesto Gospel Mission and Jesus Christ.

02 12-Month New Life Program (Women)


Using Jesus Christ as a foundation, the New Life Program encourages women as they prepare to return to society. The New Life Program helps people escape and recover from homelessness and addiction by teaching them practical, spiritual, emotional, social, educational, vocational, and financial skills. It's a 12-month program where residents work around the facilities to rebuild their work ethic; they're encouraged to go to church, and they're taught hands-on transferrable skills. They'll meet with a Case Manager or Chaplain every week, and they'll also attend daily Bible studies, finance advice once a week, and get help finding a local church. As part of the program, residents take classes like Anger Management, Addiction Studies, Healthy Boundaries, and Career Development. As soon as the program residents finish career development, they're helped find outside jobs. As soon as they're employed, they have six months to save money, pay off debts, buy a car, and save for a place to live.

O3 Freedom Road Program



Freedom Road is a structured day program, operating every day, 8:30am -4:30pm. This program provides a safe environment for unhoused men and women to find refuge from the streets of Modesto. We aim to build and strengthen supportive relationships with other agencies alongside the Modesto Gospel Mission team. Freedom Road provides activities that include recovery meetings, praise and worship, Bible studies, peer support groups, and arts and crafts. Freedom Road also provides life skills classes, specifically working on; decision making, problem solving, effective communication, interpersonal relationships, money management, coping skills, and anger management. Other resources available through case management are identification vouchers, birth certificates, social security cards, job resources, and housing referrals. Computers are available for employment opportunities, housing search, and resume building.

Immediate needs such as shelter, lunch, clothing, hygiene, bathroom facilities, and showers are also met in the day program.

Freedom Road looks forward to assisting you on your journey back to a stable living environment through the resources provided and the restorative power of Jesus Christ.

Open to the public 5 days a week, the Youth Center is open for regular activities from 2:30pm to 7pm. On Friday nights from 9pm to 11pm the Youth Center opens its doors to teens for a program called G.A.T.E. (God's Anointed Teen Event). G.A.T.E provides community teens a safe place to hang out during a Friday night as a safe alternative during a time most would spend on the streets.

The purpose of the Youth Center is to provide a safe, well-rounded, and nurturing environment for the health and wellbeing of our kids and their families. Local ministries join us in hosting faith-filled devotions, coping skills, book clubs, and indoor and outdoor fun activities to foster personal growth in self-esteem, community service, and hope. Each weeknight, the youth and their families can eat dinner for free at the Mission.

Academic support, such as tutoring, GPA checks, and school advocacy is provided. The Youth Center also provides snacks, school supplies, hygiene kits, clothes, and shoes.

Resources for employment, scholarships, housing, counseling, activities, and more are also provided through various local partnerships, such as 10k with a Cop, Youth for Christ, Americans Veteran's First, Beyond the Walls, Civil Air Patrol Squadron 50, and more! The Mission believes in offering as much support as possible to ensure our youth have all they need to be successful at home, in school, and in their future.

01 Meal Service



The Modesto Gospel Mission serves 600 meals a day, 7 days a week, 365 days of the year. We serve 2 breakfasts, 1 lunch, 2 dinners and 2 snacks per day to the poor and homeless in the community. The food served by the Mission is donated by individuals and businesses in the area, and our service provides warm meals to individuals and families where the only meal they may be able to eat that day is from the Mission.

The Mission also provides daily "to go" meals to any member of the homeless community to receive and take with them off campus.

During Thanksgiving the Mission serves around 1,500 meals to the community, and at Christmas we serve close to 2,500 meals to men, women, and children during the holidays. Our meal service is a vital part of the Modesto Gospel Mission and could not be what it is today without the help and support of our sponsors and the Stanislaus community.


02 Hygiene Kits & Clothes

Throughout the year, we distribute these kits. These are designed to help with essential hygiene needs. Get your own travel-size toiletries or buy them at Bridges for \$4 a kit, in quantities of 50.

The following should be in each kit:

- Soap
- Shampoo
- Deodorant
- Body Lotion
- Shaving Cream
- Razor
- Toothbrush
- Toothpaste
- Socks





The overnight shelter program provides 150 beds for men and women and children for emergency shelter every night in 2 separate buildings. Guests are provided with a safe place to sleep overnight as well as showers, meals, and chapel services during their stay, and case management services are provided to those who consistently come to the Mission for overnight shelter.

The overnight towards program aims to be a stepping stone on the road towards permanent housing, and aims to provide hope for the future and provide pretend ical resources for shelter guests as they look for jobs, stable housing, and attempt to transform their lives. The Mission provides a total of 225 beds for men, women, and children every night (emergency shelter, New Life Program residents, and single father units). The Mission also provides additional transitional housing and lowrent housing to program graduates and senior women throughout Stanislaus County.

FREE CLOTHING

The Modesto Gospel Mission runs the Central Valley's largest free distribution program, giving away new and gently-used clothes to people experiencing homelessness and poverty. Casual clothes, warm clothes, business clothes, and children's clothes are all available for free to recipients.

We follow Jesus and recognize everyone's inherent dignity as all are made in the image of God. To make it easy for our guests, we arrange our clothes in a warehouse-like environment so they can pick the items that match their style and needs. We make sure only high-quality donated clothes make their way to our racks. Providing friendly service and keeping the store clean and organized is our goal.

FREE FOOD

At the Modesto Gospel Mission, uncooked food is provided to those in need through a warehouse in which food is stored. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, we are open from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon. Feel free to stop by and get some free food and clothes if you need it.

05 Shower Shuttle

Every Tuesday, we work with our partner, the Shower Shuttle, to give hot showers, underwear, socks, and hygiene kits to the homeless, underserved, and working poor. To restore the hope so desperately lost in today's society, we need to engage the lost and broken. This isn't just a shower. The goal is to re-humanize the individual by meeting their basic needs.




