Everything I Have Came From Surrendering to Him.

I came to the Modesto Gospel Mission after being released from jail. My addiction—alcohol and opiates—had taken over my life, destroyed relationships, and ultimately landed me behind bars. That brokenness is what led me to the New Life Program.

During the program, I worked in the kitchen and served in Rescue. I spent about nine months in the kitchen before being asked to move to the night desk. That's where I learned how to do intakes, how the shelter operates, and what case management looks like. Those experiences eventually led me to become a shelter case manager. I graduated from the program in February 2025.

Since then, God has completely transformed my life. I proposed to my my girlfriend at my graduation, and I was married in February 2026. We have moved into a new home. God has restored relationships and opened

doors I never imagined. I'm also in college, working toward my Associate of Science in Addiction Treatment and my Bachelor's in Recovery Coaching.

Today, I'm a full-time shelter case manager at the Mission with about 40 men on my caseload. I get to sit with them during intake, see them in the same broken place I once was, and walk with them through their triggers, emotions, and struggles—just as the chaplains once did for me. My wife and I attend a wonderful home church, Haven of Hope in Keyes. I'm surrounded by mentors, friends, and a strong community. This Mission truly saved my life. It gave me stability, housing, employment, purpose, and hope. Most importantly, it brought me back to Christ. Everything I have—school, work, my marriage, my recovery—comes from fully surrendering to Him. I've learned that it's not through my strength, but through the Lord's, that my life has been restored.

This Program Helped Me Become a Better Mother.

We came to Modesto from Anchorage, Alaska, and for almost two years my son and I were homeless. Our journey was not easy. I was asked to leave the Mission several times, but each time I returned, I grew more grateful. No matter what, the Mission always offered me a warm bed, clean sheets, and good food—blessings I never took for granted. That consistency helped me calm down, accept support, and realize this could truly be a place to start over.

When I joined the New Life Program, I began another important chapter. This program has helped me grow,

heal, and become a better mother. I no longer wake up stressed or angry, wondering where we'll sleep. Now I wake up grateful—listening to gospel music, getting Nehemiah ready for school, walking him peacefully, and showing him love. This program is a fresh start for anyone who feels lost or forgotten. The staff genuinely care, and many have walked through experiences similar to ours. My chaplain, Chaplain Anna, is tough but caring, and she has helped me more than she knows.

The Mission Gave Me a Place to Stay.

I came to the Modesto Gospel Mission looking for shelter, warmth, and food. Over time, I've gotten to know many of the staff members who serve our meals and help keep the place safe when things get rowdy. I've met a lot of different people who come and go, but the Mission has always given me a warm bed, hot meals—breakfast, lunch, and dinner—and a place to rest.

They also have social services that help us look for housing, financial support, and other resources. The conditions here are really good. The restrooms are kept clean, the dining area is clean, and the beds are warm at night. The staff is friendly, and they help all of us.

I've been homeless for a little over two months. Before this, I was living with my brother-in-law, but I couldn't

pay my part of the rent for a few months. He couldn't wait for my disability decision, so he told me I had to leave. I tried other places, but there were no vouchers or openings, especially with the holidays approaching.

So, I came to the Mission. I had heard a few concerns before, but I didn't have anywhere else to go. Before becoming homeless, I was working in Tracy at a meal-prep company, packing ingredients for home-cooked meal kits. I lost that job unexpectedly.

For now, I'm grateful the Mission is here for me. It has helped me through a very difficult time.

We participate in 10K With a Cop and mentorship programs that teach us how to overcome challenges

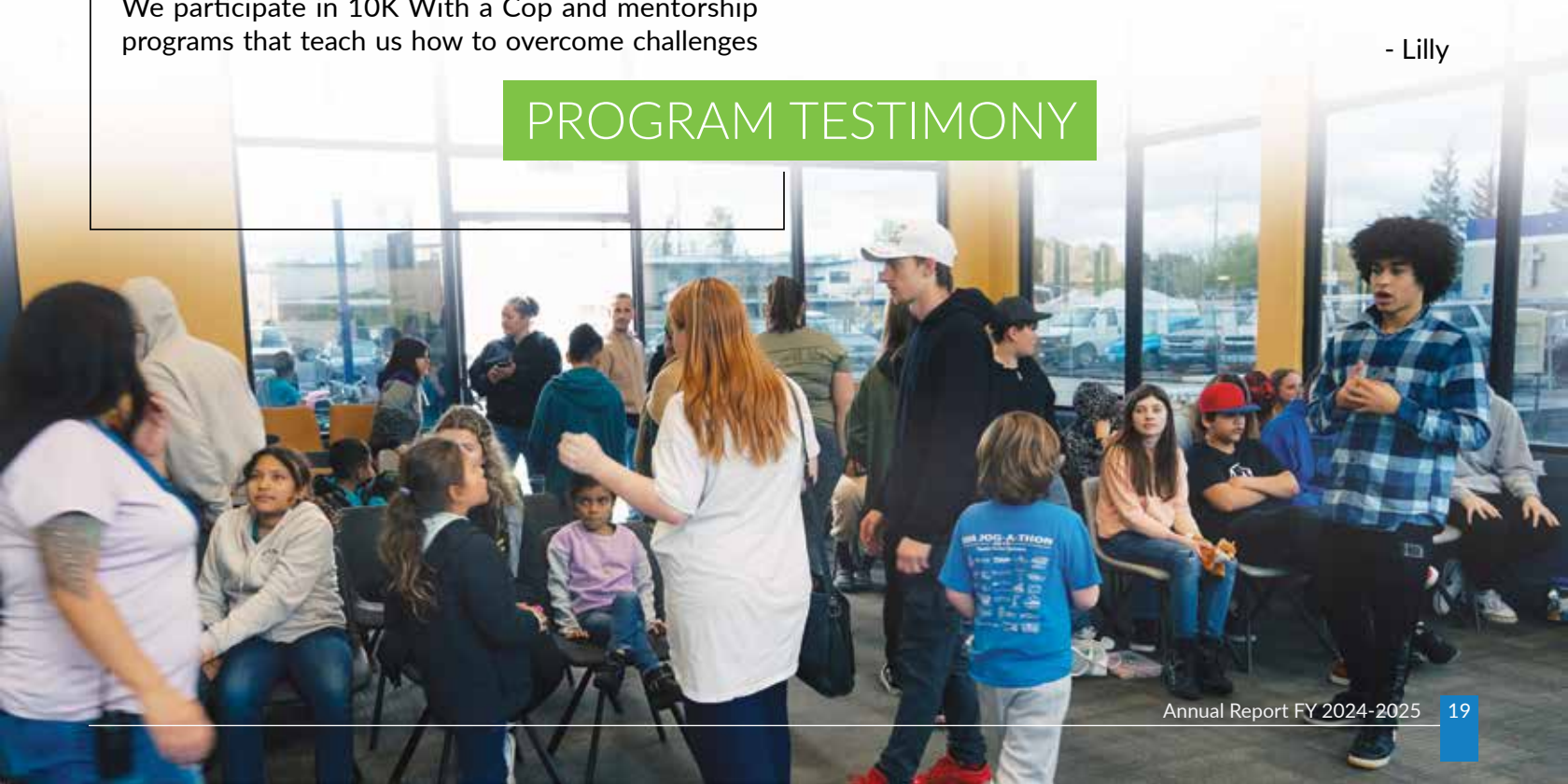
and be successful. There are lots of fun activities, but our favorite part is learning about Jesus. And we even got to go to the 49ers Stadium!

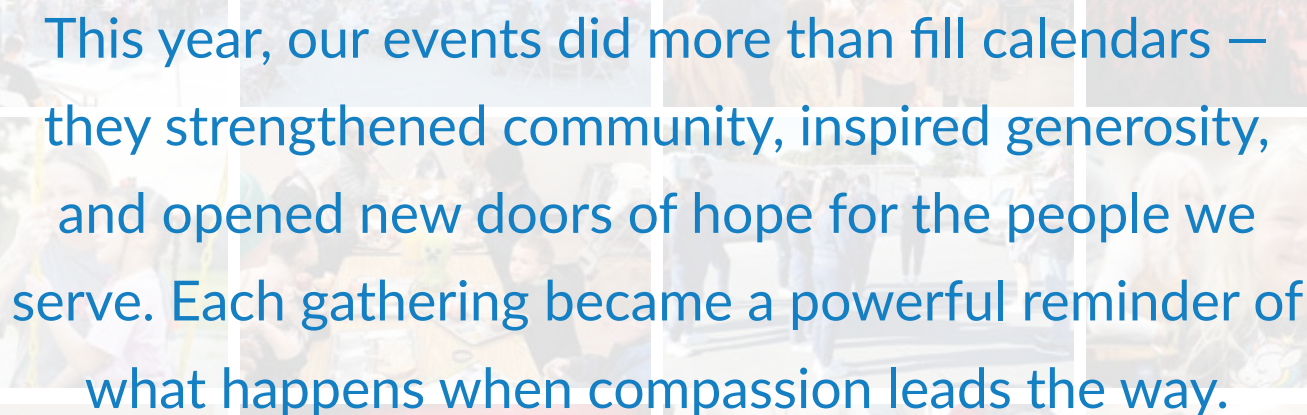
